

## Situational Usage

What would you say in the following situations?

1. Inform that there are a cat and a dog under the desk.
2. Inform that the hospital is located between the supermarket and the hotel over there.
3. You are looking at a photo. Ask who the person next to Professor Yamashita is.
4. Ask if there were any American students at college.
5. There was a movie showing at your school. Your classmate asked if it was a Japanese movie. Tell him that it was not a Japanese movie.
6. Your neighbors were trying to recall that the movie night of the town was on August 3rd and 4th. Ask them if it wasn't August 5th and 6th.
7. Ask your classmate what his older brother's major when he was in graduate school was.
8. Ask a student what language that the international student over there understands.
9. Invite your classmate to meet in front of the library at 5PM on Monday.
10. Seek confirmation that Mr. Tanaka went to Nagoya with his elder sister on September 2nd.
11. A colleague said he bought a souvenir at the department store near the park. Tell him that you, too, bought a souvenir over there a little while ago.
12. Ask your colleague about how many hours he waited for Mr. Yamamoto at the restaurant.
13. Ask if Ms. Takeda took many photos of the temples in Kyoto.
14. Inform that you wrote a letter to a friend from high school at the coffee shop last Wednesday.
15. Your classmate gave you an instruction of how to use a copy machine in fluent Japanese. Apologize, telling him that you didn't understand it at all.
16. Your colleague asked which one, rice or bread, you used to eat for breakfast when you were a child. Tell him that you ate bread everyday when you were a child, and that you didn't eat rice so often.
17. Your colleague asks if you met Mr. Tanaka's family. Tell her that you met Tanaka's mother the day before yesterday. Also, tell her that you met Tanaka's father, too.
18. Tanaka was looking for his dictionary. Tell her that it was under Tanaka's bag.
19. You are asked where you play tennis. Tell him you play at a park behind the hotel, and that you sometimes play at the university, too.
20. Your classmates asked you if you study with friends. Tell her that you usually study by yourself.
21. Ask your colleague who she went shopping with on Tuesday.
22. Your colleague told you that she would not be able to come to a party. Ask her why.
23. Ask if there is a bus stop in front of the post office.
24. You've been asked how long your classes are. Tell him that Japanese class is one hour and a half long.
25. Ask your colleague if she has a note and pencil.
26. You were asked what you bought yesterday. Tell him that you bought a pair of shoes and a dress. And, add that you also bought CD, too.
27. What would you say when you return from school.
28. Ask when your colleague went to Kyoto.

29. Ask your acquaintance which days of the week she has a part-time job.
30. You were asked where Starbucks is. Inform her it is inside the department store over there. Also, tell her that there is one near the park.
