

Situational Usage

What would you say in the following situations?

1. Ask your friend which is taller, Keiko or Yuko.
2. Tell your colleague that Takashi is better at singing songs than Robert.
3. Tell that (going by) airplane is the fastest from Tokyo to Osaka among airplanes, bullet trains and buses, but it is most expensive.
4. Ask your friend which he likes best, Japanese food, Chinese food and Italian food.
5. Ask your colleague what she likes best among sports.
6. Ask your classmate who has the longest hair in class.
7. Your friend wants to buy a new sweater. You are asked which looks better on her, red one or blue one. Tell her that the blue one is better.
8. You found a Japanese textbook on the desk after class. Pick it up and ask your classmate whose this is.
9. Tell your colleague that you intend to stay your friend's house this weekend.
10. Your colleague told you that he intends not to go out tomorrow. Report what he told you to other colleague.
11. It became very warm these days. Describe the change.
12. Tell your friend that you intend to become a doctor, so you are studying a lot.
13. Ask your colleague if he has been to anywhere last night.
14. You are chatting with your acquaintance over the Internet. Write to her that it was very cold and snowed yesterday. Therefore, you didn't go anywhere. You read books and watched TV at home.
15. Tell your friend that it took one hour by bus from your home to hospital.
16. Tell your colleague that your room became very clean because you cleaned it.
17. Ask a store clerk if you can pay with a credit card.
18. You are at an apartment with your real estate agent. Ask her how long it takes to university on foot.
19. Tell your classmate that you will go to study in Japan in one month, and that you intend to be in Japan for six months.
20. Tell your colleague that you talk in English with your father but in Spanish with your mother.
21. Comment to your colleague that this town has become livelier than before.
22. Tell your friend that your baggage is bigger than Mary's.
23. Tell your colleague that you think Suzuki came to the office earlier than Tanaka did today.
24. Ask your friend who is studying Japanese which she thinks easier between reading and speaking.
25. Your friend asks you if you still speak French. Tell her that you become not speak French these days.
26. Your colleague asks you if you plan to do anything this weekend. Tell him that you plan to go somewhere.
