

## Situational Usage

1. Tell your colleague that you think that Boston is a very lively town.  
ボストンはとてもにぎやかな<sup>まち</sup>町 だと思います。
2. Your colleague asked you about another colleague Yamamoto. Tell him that Yamamoto had said that she would go shopping in New York this weekend.  
山本さんは<sup>しゅうまつ</sup>週末 ニューヨークに<sup>か</sup>買<sup>もの</sup>い物 をしに行くと言っていましたよ。
3. You are working at a museum. You noticed that a visitor is taking a picture. Request not to take a picture.  
<sup>しゃしん</sup>写真 と<sup>と</sup>撮らないでください。
4. Ask your friend if he cooks often.  
<sup>りょうり</sup>よく料理 する？
5. Ask your American colleague what he thinks of Japanese foods.  
日本の食<sup>もの</sup>べ物 について、どう思いますか。
6. Tell your colleague that Keiko's room is always clean, but that she told you that she doesn't clean her room everyday.  
<sup>へや</sup>けいこさんの部屋 はいつもきれいですが、毎日<sup>そうじ</sup>掃除 しないとっていました。
7. Tell your colleague that you think that Japanese is not difficult, but that Mary thinks that it is difficult.  
日本語はむずかしくないと思いますが、メアリーさんはむずかしいと思っています。
8. You saw your neighbor is wondering about today's weather. Tell her that it will not rain today, according to the weather forecast.  
<sup>てんきよほう</sup>天気予報 <sup>あめ</sup>で今日雨 <sup>ふ</sup>が降らないと言っていましたよ。
9. Ask your friend if she has a test in political science class tomorrow.  
<sup>あした</sup>明日、<sup>せいじ</sup>政治 のクラスのテストがある？
10. Tell your friend that you like cooking, but you are not good at it.  
<sup>りょうり</sup>料理 <sup>す</sup>するのが好きだけど、<sup>じょうず</sup>上手 じゃない。
11. Ask your colleague if he will bring something to Keiko's birthday party.  
<sup>たんじょうび</sup>けいこさんの誕生日 パーティに何か<sup>も</sup>持 っ て行きますか。
12. Tell your colleague that you didn't do anything yesterday, so it was very boring.  
きのうは何もしませんでしたから、とてもつまらなかったです。
13. You don't want your colleague to call you late at night. Ask her not to call you late at night.

夜遅く電話をかけないでください。

14. You heard that some people at work went to New York by car this weekend. Find out who drove the car.

だれが車を うんてん  
運転 しましたか。

15. You were invited to a barbecue party at your friend's house. You heard that one of your friends would not be able to come because he has a part-time job. Express your disappointment.

ざんねん  
残念 だねえ。

16. Your colleague, Keiko, thinks that Mary speaks Japanese very well. Agree with Keiko.

わたし  
私 もそう思います。

17. Your colleague asked you about another colleague Kimura. Tell your colleague that Kimura had told you that she often goes swimming at the pool because she likes swimming.

きむら およ す およ  
木村さんは泳ぐのが好きだから、よくプールに泳ぎに行くと言っていました。

18. Your classmate is taking five classes. Ask which class is interesting.

どのクラスがおもしろい？

19. You heard that your neighbor likes playing tennis. Tell him that you are bad at playing tennis, but you like it. Invite him to play on Sunday.

テニスをするのが へた ですが、好きです。日曜日に 一緒に にテニスをしま  
せんか。

20. Tell your friend that you don't like to go see a movie alone.
