Description:

Everyone begins as an ‘egg’, so students all crouch down on the ground with their arms around their knees. They must then find another egg and play ‘rock, paper, scissors’ with them. Whoever wins gets to ‘evolve’ into a chicken, so the winning student pretends to be a chicken. Whoever loses remains an egg and tries to evolve again. Then the chickens must find other chickens in order to play rock, paper, scissors while the eggs must play with other eggs. Whoever wins each match evolves; whoever loses devolves. The winner of a match between two chickens becomes a dinosaur. Then the winner between two dinosaurs becomes a ninja and the winner between two ninjas becomes a human and wins!

Description:
